

■ Anybody who's anybody (and even a few nobodies) should soon be getting their inauguration mailings soon.

Edgar's inauguration committee is mailing 5,000 to 6,000 invitations to the Jan. 9 event. Don't worry about crowd control, though — most people who receive invitations don't attend. They simply use them as souvenirs of the coronation.

All six statewide elected officials send out their own invites. For example, Secretary of State GEORGE RYAN, who commands the second-largest payroll (and campaign war chest), is sending out about 4,000.

Which brings us to Treasurer-elect JUDY BAAR TOPINKA. One administration source sardonically said Topinka appears to be sending an invitation to everyone in her Senate district.

Not quite, although Topinka's list of 5,000 invitees is pretty hefty indeed for a relatively small office. A Topinka aide said everyone who made a contribution to Topinka's campaign will get an invitation. But Topinka is being allotted only 300 tickets for people to actually attend the ceremony.

Speaking of Topinka's inauguration, she may win the award for the guest who travels the farthest distance to attend.

Topinka's son serves in the Army and is stationed in Fairbanks, Alaska. He will be attending.

Biggest crowd award could go to Ryan, George.
He's got six children, 10 grandchildren, a brother, a sister and all of their related families coming to Springfield for the big event. There will be so many Ryans that George is using campaign funds to hire a tour bus to shuttle them from event to event.

What a way to start the new year.
On Jan. 4, precisely at 10:30 a.m., outgoing Treasurer PAT QUINN plans to hold another of his famous news conferences.

Quinn's topic has not been disclosed, but it reportedly will deal with his political agenda. That could be interesting, since his state political career ends (well, at least for now) on Jan. 9.

Clearly, this power grab by the new Republican majority has gotten way out of hand.

For example, the vending machine on the third floor of the Statehouse now boasts something called "Pate's Caramel Corn."

Coincidence? Hard to say. MARK GORDON, spokesman for Senate President JAMES "PATE"

PHILIP, sidestepped the issue.
